### Food Prep/Storage/Water/Canning

Dave and Bonnie Hawkins shared some great information with the group about Food Storage. Thank you to both of them for doing the footwork and sharing with the group! Here is the information:

[www.providentliving.org](http://www.providentliving.org) This is a warehouse run by the Mormons. This website has information and an order form you can print off. Click on home, then the storage tab. They are open to the public Tuesdays and Saturdays 10am-2pm and the 2<sup>nd</sup> Friday of each month from 4pm-8pm. They sell some items that are already canned. For the items that are not canned, you can buy the cans, lids and oxygen absorber from them.

They will also let you “borrow” the machine to do the actually canning. There is no charge for the machine. They lend it out on the honor system. Most of the food stays good for 30 yrs. They accept cash or checks. The name of the warehouse is The Indianapolis Home Storage Center located at 5151 W. 84<sup>th</sup> St., Indy, 46268. Their phone is 317-984-4210.

Another place they mentioned is The Ready Store, which sells canned food, but is more expensive than The Indy Home Storage Center. Samsclub.com and Costco also sell bulk food that you would be able to can yourself.

Lastly, they confirmed that you can buy used 55 gallon drums for water, from Suburban products, for \$5 each. Obviously, you will need to wash them. Dave suggested that you call ahead to see if they have them available. They don’t always carry them in stock. Suburban Products is located at 3341 W. US Hwy 40, Greenfield, IN 46140. Their phone is 317-462-4438.
